

#### National Handloom Week Celebration

In a joint initiative to promote the rich heritage of handloom and handicrafts, Department of Industries and Commerce, Government of Rajasthan organized NATIONAL HANDLOOM WEEK 2023 from 3-7 August, 2023 at Jawahar Kala Kendra, Jaipur (JKK). The event consisted of Buyer seller meet on 3rd and 4th Aug, Exhibition and Theme Pavilion from 3rd to 7th Aug, Quiz competition on 3rd Aug, Workshop on 4 Aug, and Fashion show at Rajasthan International Center on 6 Aug, 2023. IICD was felicitated with certificates by the Department of Industries and Commerce, Government of Rajasthan acknowledging IICD's contribution in the National handloom Week event.

#### **Quiz Competition**

# MoU signed with IIT-Kanpur and Training Program

RSK IIT Kanpur reached out to the Institute to discuss potential collaboration. This led to the signing of an MoU between RSK IITK and IICD to revitalize the craft sector and enhance the livelihood of artisans and women groups through design development. The objective of this collaboration is to preserve the traditional art and craft, develop improved processes and come up with new forms and designs of locally made products, thus connecting artisans and craft communities to the consumers. Both IICD and RSK IIT Kanpur plan to work cooperatively on research, design and development of craft sector to make them more usable and marketable. A visit was done by Director and DR(P&C), IICD to the IIT-Kanpur where they met the artisans who were working there. Based on the discussion regarding availability of resources with IIT team and with artisans regarding their requirements it was finalized to conduct training program of 7-10 days in terracotta and textile bag making. The trainings took place during the month of August at Ranjit Singh Rozi Shiksha Kendra (RSK) at IIT Kanpur campus. IICD faculty team was involved in the training.

artisans will be mobilized to create a Self Help Group.
The artisans will be trained on design development
and other relevant skills. Market linkages will be
created for the cluster products through development
of website, participation in exhibitions and online
marketing.

A training program of one month duration was conducted at village Gagriya, Disrict-Barmer

during the month of September 2023. There were 40 participants who were imparted design development skills in two batches. The training was conducted by IICD faculty- Mr. Rajesh Kumar and Lab technician Mr. Suresh Manohar was also a part of the training along with master craftsperson Chandi Devi and Samjhu Devi.




#### IIM Calcutta - Radhesh Agrahari
