

# Crafts Business Accelerator Program 2024

## Rules and Regulations

1. The program consists of three modules, spanning over five months. Successful completion of each module is required to progress to the next level within the stipulated time period.
2. To be recognized as a program graduate, candidates must successfully complete all three modules and meet the performance criteria set by the program.
3. Candidate progress will be assessed through a combination of assignments, practical projects, and presentations, as determined by the program instructors.  
A minimum performance threshold must be achieved to advance to the subsequent module.
4. The Crafts Business Incubator Program is administered by the program management team, whose decisions are final and binding on all participants.
5. Candidates accepted into the program are expected to dedicate sufficient time and effort to complete all required activities and assignments.  
Regular attendance of lectures, workshops, meeting mentors and other program-related events is mandatory.
6. All candidates are expected to maintain a high standard of professionalism, respect, and integrity throughout the program.
7. Plagiarism and any form of academic dishonesty are strictly prohibited and may lead to immediate disqualification.
8. The program management reserves the right to disqualify candidates who violate the program's rules, engage in misconduct, or fail to meet performance standards.
9. Candidates may be exposed to sensitive business information during the program.  
Respect for the confidentiality of such information is imperative.
10. Candidates who wish to withdraw from the program must formally notify the program management in writing.
11. Upon successful completion of the program, candidates will be awarded a certificate of completion by IICD as a testament to their dedication and skills acquired.
